Interior Formatting.
After editing is finished, complete another outline to designate which text and which illustrations go to each page of the book.
Left-hand pages are even numbered, right-hand pages are odd numbered
Use an appropriate font for your primary (story) text.
Load text and illustrations to their assigned pages.
Ensure font size is appropriate for target reader age.
Ensure visual flow on each page of text.
Ensure all illustrations fit on pages without pixelation or distortion.
Number each page. Remember, even are left-side pages, odd are on righ
